



NOTICE OF UPCOMING HAZARD ABATEMENT

Roadside Clearance on: Center Boulevard in October 2026

Dear Current Owner/Resident,

The Ross Valley Fire Department recently conducted an evacuation route evaluation of Center Boulevard. **Immediate abatement of all vegetation 10 feet off the roadway, as well as vertical clearance of 15 feet** is needed in accordance with Wildland Urban-Interface Code Section 604-Fire Hazard Reduction from Roadways and California Fire Code Section 503-Fire Apparatus Access Roads. This clearance helps to ensure safe routes of travel for both residents during evacuations and firefighters responding to an emergency. Roadside clearance work will be conducted with Measure C funds provided by the Marin Wildfire Prevention Authority (MWPA).

Work is scheduled to be conducted in October. The work will span from Fire Station 19 in San Anselmo to Pastori Avenue in Fairfax. Crews will be conducting various types of fuel reduction which include but are not limited to:

- Removing vegetation 10 feet off the edge of the roadway
- Raising tree canopies a minimum of 15 feet above roadways
- Removal of dead and dying vegetation (including trees)
- Removing hazardous species including, but not limited to bamboo, juniper and cypress

Where possible, crews will do their best to not disrupt the flow of traffic on Center Boulevard. When work must be done on the boulevard, lane closure information will be posted in advance.

This project will be presented to the Fairfax Town Council on Wednesday, October 7th at 6:30 PM at the Women's Club located in Fairfax. For more information visit the Town of Fairfax's website.
