



NOTICE OF UPCOMING HAZARD ABATEMENT

Roadside Clearance on: Center Boulevard starting October 5, 2026

Dear Current Owner/Resident,

The Ross Valley Fire Department recently conducted an evacuation route evaluation of Center Boulevard. **Abatement of certain vegetation 10 feet off the roadway, as well as vertical clearance of 15 feet** is required in accordance with Wildland Urban-Interface Code Section 604-Fire Hazard Reduction from Roadways and California Fire Code Section 503-Fire Apparatus Access Roads. This clearance helps to ensure safe routes of travel for both residents during evacuations and firefighters responding to an emergency. Roadside clearance work will be conducted with Measure C funds provided by the Marin Wildfire Prevention Authority (MWPA). When work must be done on the boulevard, lane closure information will be posted in advance.

Work is scheduled to begin October 5th at the San Anselmo Ave-Center Blvd intersection by Fire Station 19. The work will span from the San Anselmo Ave-Center Blvd intersection in San Anselmo to Pastori Avenue in Fairfax. Crews will be conducting various types of fuel reduction which include but are not limited to:

- Removing vegetation 10 feet off the edge of the roadway
- Raising tree canopies a minimum of 15 feet above roadways
- Removal of dead and dying vegetation (including trees)
- Removing hazardous species including, but not limited to bamboo, palms, juniper and cypress

We understand that vegetation is used as a privacy, noise and pollution buffer in some places. We will do our best to work with surrounding property owners on maintenance to retain as much of that screening where possible. **Please note that screening comprised of hazardous species will be removed.**
